What is AT??

 AT Devices are any item, piece of equipment, or product--whether acquired commercially or customized--that is used to increase, maintain or improve the functional capabilities of a person with a disability

AT can be Low Tech >>>> High Tech

 AT Services help a person learn about their AT options and decide if the AT will benefit them

- Section 19: HCBS for the Elderly and for Adults with Disabilities
- Section 20: HCBS for Adults with Other Related Conditions (ORC)
- Section 21: HCBS for Members with Intellectual Disabilities or Autistic Disorder
- Section 29: Support Services for Adults with Intellectual Disabilities or Autistic Disorder

What is new?

#1!! The new Maine CARE Waivers support people living in the community

- Avoid more costly institutional care (shifts funding)
- Creates funding for AT use in the community to increase safety & independence (\$\$\$\$)
- Expands practice opportunities for therapists
- . New funding for home based remote monitoring
- Supports training on how to use AT
